

09.30 - 10.30	The revised Version 7 Inspection scheme and the e-learning accreditation scheme	Susanna Dammann and Tim Goodier, Chair of the E-Learning Working Group, will present the work of the project groups which are updating the general inspection scheme and designing a scheme to accredit e-learning.	

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		They will give an overview of the new inspection scheme categories and criteria and the rationale behind them; the new Application Form for schools to complete; The new Report Template; the new Manual and the scope and focus of the E-Learning Scheme within Version 7.
11.00 - 11.30	Discussion and feedback from members on Version 7 and the e-learning scheme	Delegates will have the opportunity to comment on the development of Version 7 of the accreditation scheme and the e-learning scheme.
11.35 - 13.00	In times of rapid change, how is technology adding quality to the provision of English language learning?	In this interactive talk Nik Peachey will explore a number of recent trends in educational technology and look at what they have to offer the language classroom and beyond. Topics will include mobile learning and tablet devices, blended learning, digital literacy and cloud based learning. Nik will examine how these can impact on what happens within our classrooms and how they can add quality to what our teachers do and how our students learn.
		Nik Peachey has been involved in ELT since 1992. He has worked all over the world as a language teacher, teacher trainer and technology trainer. In 2003 he took over and managed the newly launched British Council BBC TeachingEnglish website http://teachingenglish.org.uk/ and developed it into one of the world's leading web based resources for English language teachers. Since 2007 he has been working freelance as a technology writer, trainer and consultant. He creates custom made face-to-face and online training courses for teachers. In May 2012 Nik won a prestigious ELTon award from the British Council for Excellence in course Innovation for a blended learning course he developed for Bell Educational Services.
14.00 - 15.30 and 16.00 - 17.30	Presentations: Using EAQUALS tools and resources	These sessions will present materials and resources that EAQUALS has developed in each of the 4 thematic areas and explain how they can be used in practice in member schools. The sessions will be repeated so that delegates can attend 2 out of the 4 sessions on offer. At the end of the afternoon, delegates will choose which theme to join for the discussion/swap shop session on Saturday morning.
14.00 - 15.30 repeated at 16.00 - 17.30	Commonality and Collegiality: reviewing EAQUALS Staff Management resources	Jo Watson will present current EAQUALS resources in the areas of Staff Management and Teacher Development. She will suggest when and how these resources could be exploited and consider why they may not be better used. Delegates will have the opportunity to share any problems and/or difficulties of Quality Assurance from their own experience.
14.00 - 15.30 repeated at 16.00 - 17.30	Using the European Profiling Grid and the EAQUALS Teacher Development Framework in your institution	The European Profiling Grid (or EPG) project involving 11 partners has just ended. The aim of the EPG is to support teacher development and performance management by facilitating self-assessment by teachers and assessment of their work by managers. Meanwhile within EAQUALS a group has compiled a comprehensive open-ended 'framework' based on categories from the EPG to aid the design of inservice training and provide a source of focus points for development.
		In this session people involved in one or both projects will outline the main content and uses of these tools, point out how they can complement each other, and respond to questions and comments from participants.

14.00 - 15.30 repeated at 16.00 - 17.30	CEFR-based tools and resources: latest developments	The CEFR has become something of a trade mark for EAQUALS. In this session, Mila Angelova and Ela Jarosz will present key recent developments and familiarize delegates with the resources that are available in this area: the new Speaking and Reading Scenarios, the EAQUALS Certificate of Achievement Scheme, the launch of the Core Inventory for French, and many more. Members' suggestions for further training and support in this area will be welcomed.	
14.00 - 15.30 repeated at 16.00 - 17.30	Creating a digital environment for language schools	Students expect to have digital access to personal learning, school information and basic tasks, but getting the balance right between face-to-face services and digital support can get confusing, and making this kind of change in a school requires planning. In this session David Coarsey of Guided e-learning will explore 3 questions and how different schools have dealt with them: What are useful services to offer digitally?; How should digital services be offered?; What is involved in implementing digital services?	
	Using Facebook in your school: content, promotion, advertising & analytics	Stephen Shortt will provide a practical guide to improving your social media presence on Facebook, to help you to get attention and hopefully to get more customers. His session will include setting your content apart from the rest; engaging with your audience; promoting your best work to more and more clients; paid and organic strategies; running ads to target your potential students and pulling it all together by understanding your analytics.

11.45 - 12.45	Questions and Challenges for Quality Management in Language Education:	Over the past 20 years QM approaches have developed widely in language education and a good degree of community of practice has been established - with a major contribution from EAQUALS in this area. But there are still challenges to be faced: there are various models for QM - client satisfaction, fitness for purpose etc. Does it make sense to bundle them together under a single label "QM"? Is there any research evidence of the effectiveness of QM approaches? Is there a risk that quality labels and inspection / audit procedures encourage a superficial conformity? Is it enough to have QM procedures which identify and eliminate defects, or can we also do more to promote positive quality?
