
Student Progress dashboard


Differential diagnosis - page 1

1. There is a big difference between writing performance in Elementary class 1 and class 2 related to correcting simple mistakes in text.

2. Class demographics data shows us that the age ranges are similar and that there is a good mix of nationalities in both classes.

3. We can see that Class 1 covered this aim 4 times, and Class 2 covered it twice!

5. The notes show us that Class 2 had a good skills focus: students wrote a letter and made corrections. Test results were strong.

6. Class 1 had much more of a grammar focus. Test results were poor.


ACTION: The data shows us that the overall results are broadly the same in both classes, so we can work with the teacher in Class 1 on better methods to teach this aim.


